- (b) If more than one notice of an Opposition Day is filed on the same Wednesday, the Speaker shall select which one will be considered.
- (c) After 2 hours of debate on an Opposition Day held on a Monday, or at 5:35 p.m. on an Opposition Day held on a Tuesday or Wednesday, the Speaker shall interrupt the proceedings and put the question without further debate. If a recorded vote is requested, the division bells shall be limited to 10 minutes. Such vote may not be deferred.

Standing Order 43(b) is amended by deleting "5:50 p.m." and substituting "5:35 p.m."

Standing Order 45(a) is deleted and the following substituted:

45.(a) Motions to adjourn the House or the debate do not require notice, but a motion to adjourn the House may not be moved until following Routine Proceedings, except upon unanimous consent of the House.

17. Ms. DiNovo – That, in the opinion of this House, a housing tax be levied on incomes in excess of \$500,000 per annum of 5% that will go directly to Affordable Housing construction and not into general revenue.

Withdrawn March 19, 2008.

- 18. Ms. DiNovo That, in the opinion of this House, 25% of all Ontario places of employment be inspected each year.
- 19. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should:
 - a) Proclaim a regulation that implements an immediate temporary moratorium on issuing or renewing licences to operate Child Care Centres due to the potential consequences brought to light by present plans to acquire and consolidate ownership of existing for-profit operators;
 - b) Order a full policy review of child care in Ontario to ensure that future expansion only occurs in the not-for-profit sector upon ending the moratorium.
- 20. Mr. Moridi That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario must demonstrate, in its promotion of diversity, the acknowledgement of the first day of Spring, which may be anytime between March 20th to the 22nd, as *Nowruz*.

Debated and carried April 10, 2008.

- 21. Mr. Wilson That, in the opinion of this House, due to the potato industry in Ontario being subjected to the worst drought on record in 2007, affecting 30,000 out of 37,000 acres designated for potato growth, yielding the worst potato crop on record and presenting potato growers with huge losses, the Government of Ontario should instruct the Ministry of Agriculture to provide an ad hoc payment of \$12.8 million to the potato farmers of Ontario for relief from the drought of 2007.
- 22. Ms. Aggelonitis That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario affirm that an effective plan for a strong economy must include setting targets for, and investing in poverty reduction.

Debated and carried April 3, 2008.

- 23. Mrs. Mitchell That, in the opinion of this House, the Green Ribbon Beach Program, an important environmental initiative proposed by the Lake Huron Centre for Coastal Conservation, be supported. *Debated and carried April 3, 2008.*
- 24. Mr. Chudleigh That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty government should agree to define its proposed Tire Tax as a "tax", like the \$2.6 billion Health Tax, and the McGuinty government should immediately cancel all plans to implement the \$60-million tax on purchasing new tires that will impact all Ontarians.

Debated and lost on division April 10, 2008.

25. Mrs. Witmer – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should recognize positron emission tomography (PET) as a vital diagnostic tool for care, and as such should introduce an implementation plan with timelines to achieve the same level of access to PET scanning here in Ontario as in jurisdictions such as Alberta, British Columbia and Quebec.

Debated and lost on division June 5, 2008.

26. Ms. MacLeod – That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly should televise its proceedings online at www.ontla.on.ca; should make arrangements to have Bell Canada (including Satellite) televise proceedings (as Rogers Cable does) as part of their basic package; and should arrange with provincially funded cable stations TVO and TFO that daily Question Period is televised, in order to provide all residents of Ontario, particularly those in rural Ontario who do not have access to other cable sources, with access to the daily proceedings at Queen's Park.

- 27. Ms. Jones That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should immediately expand the Foodland Ontario program to include a designation for organically grown products and expand their Foodland Ontario logo to include the word "organic" where appropriate.
- 28. Mrs. Sandals That, in the opinion of this House, given the unique circumstances in the case of Steven Truscott, who was unanimously acquitted of murder by the Ontario Court of Appeal, the Province of Ontario should provide compensation to Mr. Truscott in recognition of the miscarriage of justice from which he has suffered for almost 50 years.

- 29. Ms. DiNovo That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should immediately declare this day April 17, a day to commemorate Holodomor, the genocide of the Ukrainian people. *Withdrawn May 8, 2008.*
- 30. Mr. Dunlop That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario and its Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities should immediately make the necessary regulatory changes to accommodate the construction and manufacturing trades so that the ratio of journeyman tradespeople to apprentices be one-to-one.
- 31. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should order a standalone inquest into the March 2006 murder of eight-year old Jared Osidacz, using the powers vested in the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services under Section 22 of The Coroners
- 32. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should designate children's mental health as a mandated provincial program to ensure adequate, stable and sustainable funding for the sector and the valued services it provides to Ontario's children and youth.
- 33. Mr. Qaadri That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario use all avenues to help people learn about their vital, medically significant numbers, including blood pressure, cholesterol, blood sugar, waist circumference, height, weight and body mass index.

 Debated and carried May 8, 2008.
- 34. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should proclaim the first full week from Monday to Sunday in May of each year as Children's Mental Health Week.
- 35. Mrs. Witmer That, in the opinion of this House, all Ontarians deserve to have timely access to a family doctor and that the Government of Ontario must take all steps possible to recruit new doctors to the province and retain those currently practicing here by making Ontario a more attractive place to practice medicine.
- 36. Mr. Tabuns That, in the opinion of this House, federal immigration legislation (Bill C-50) will have significant consequences for many families residing in this province, will substantially change current immigration legislation without proper consultation and will introduce substantial arbitrary elements into the administration of immigration processing, and should therefore be defeated by all parties in the Parliament of Canada.
- 37. Ms. Pendergast That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario develop an "Eat Local: Live Fresh" 'Food Miles' strategy to encourage publicly-funded schools to serve healthy, local Ontario foods to their students.

38. Mr. Hillier – That, in the opinion of this House, in order to achieve an equitable, fair and stable provincial-municipal funding arrangement, a provincial-municipal funding Act and financing formula should be adopted, to provide long-term predictable and sustainable funding that allows our municipal partners the ability to provide the required services to their residents.

Ms. DiNovo That, in the opinion of this House, Ontario Government officials not take part in the opening ceremonies of the Olympic Games in keeping with the wishes of his Holiness the Dalai Lama and the Tibetan people so as to encourage the talks between emissaries of the Tibetan people and the People's Government of China.
- 43. Mr. Lalonde That, in the opinion of this House, June 3rd be declared "Glengarry-Prescott-Russell Day" at Queen's Park, and that the date may not be changed without the approval of the majority of the municipalities in the riding of Glengarry-Prescott-Russell. Should June 3rd fall on a Friday, Saturday, or Sunday, Glengarry-Prescott-Russell day at Queen's Park will take place the following Monday.
- 43. M. Debated and lost on division September 25, 2008.

- 46. Ms. DiNovo That, in the opinion of this House, in recognition of the suffering from recent earthquakes of the Tibetan people and in conjunction with the Ontario Parliamentary Friends of Tibet and the Parliamentary Friends of Tibet in Ottawa, the torch relay of the 2008 Olympics not pass through Tibet.
- 47. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should, in support of Ontario's farmers and growers, direct all provincial public institutions such as hospitals and health care facilities, schools, universities and colleges, government ministries, agencies, boards and commissions, etc., wherever possible, to purchase Ontario grown produce and flowers on occasions where such are required.
- 48. Ms. MacLeod That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly should proclaim the twentieth (20th) day of November each year as Provincial Day of the Child to coincide with International and National Children's Day.
- 49. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should immediately approve Zenn cars and electric bicycles, as defined by Transport Canada in 2001, for permanent, legal use on Ontario roads, with the exception of 400-series highways.
- 50. Mr. Dhillon That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario, specifically the Ministry of Education, should collaborate with the Dairy Farmers of Ontario to expand the Elementary School Milk Program across Ontario's publicly funded schools, so more of Ontario's students can enjoy the benefits of healthy, local milk.

Debated and carried October 9, 2008.

- 51. Mr. Kormos That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should move expeditiously to establish and implement a comprehensive jobs program that would contain the following components:
 - A jobs-focused Manitoba and Quebec style investment tax credit that would encourage manufacturers and processors to make capital investments and create jobs.
 - An industrial hydro rate that would ensure that all major industrial and resource-based consumers would be eligible for a fair new industrial hydro rate guaranteed for five years.
 - A "Buy Ontario" program that would ensure that the billions of dollars in transit, other infrastructure investments, and health and education that governments make every year create goodpaying jobs in Ontario and not in far away places.
 - Job protection legislation that would ensure that laid-off workers receive the severance, backpay and vacation pay that is owed to them by law.
 - A jobs Commissioner and other job sustaining initiatives that would complement the above measures in protecting jobs and preventing plant closures such as the announced John Deere closure in Welland which will cost 800 workers their jobs.

Debated and lost on division October 2, 2008.

- 52. Mrs. Albanese That, in the opinion of this House, any review of safety standards for volatile fuels in Ontario should consider:
 - ability of the enforcing authority to impose fines for breach of compliance;
 - ability of the enforcing authority to track and maintain safety standards during a change of ownership;
 - review of training procedures for the storage, handling and transportation of volatile fuels;

- monitoring of administrative procedures and requirements, including adequate insurance coverage sufficient to deal with clean ups and damage to neighbouring properties;
- role of municipalities and fire services in site location, emergency planning and identification of hazardous sites;
- transparency of inspection results and public notification of non-compliant sites;
- review of frequency of inspections and reporting requirements;
- institution of buffer zones and regulatory framework for the transition of new rules for existing sites.

Debated and carried October 16, 2008.

- 53. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Ombudsman of Ontario should be granted oversight over child welfare and protection decisions so that families have a truly independent appeal mechanism available to investigate any concerns.
- 54. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, Autism Awareness Month should be officially recognized and publicly acknowledged in the Ontario Legislature in October of every year.
- 55. Mr. Arnott That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should address immediately the crisis facing physically disabled Ontarians who are waiting four to ten years for attendant services by adding attendant services to the Provincial Wait Times Strategy; and by instituting individually based funding for all physically disabled persons requiring attendant care.

 Debated and carried October 30, 2008.
- 56. Mr. Marchese That, in the opinion of this House, the Government should establish a Workforce Skills Development and Training Fund to promote and support workforce skills development and related measures and initiatives; and that the fund be administered by a committee composed of representatives of labour unions, employers and government; and that consideration be given to requiring that every employer with a payroll of \$1 million or greater contribute at least 1 percent of the payroll amount to workforce training with any shortfall of that amount being directed to the fund. **Debated and lost on division October 9, 2008.**
- 57. M^{me} Gélinas That, in the opinion of this House, simultaneous American Sign Language and langue des signes du Québec interpretation should be made available both within the Legislative Chamber and during committee hearings, and carried on the Ontario Parliamentary Broadcast of the Legislative Assembly and the proceedings of committees in the Amethyst Room in the ongoing effort to provide equal opportunity for all Ontarians to participate in the proceedings of this Assembly.
- 58. Mr. Mauro That, in the opinion of this House, the Federal Government should help make Ontario communities and families safer by providing sustainable, ongoing funding through its Police Officer Recruitment Fund, as Ontario does with both its 1,000 officer programs.

 Debated and carried November 20, 2008.
- 59. Ms. DiNovo That, in the opinion of this House, we constitute an all party women's committee to examine violence against women, its causes and our responses, and come up with an action plan for the Province of Ontario.
- 60. Mr. Brown That, in the opinion of this House, the third Sunday in July be established as Lake Superior Day, to acknowledge and celebrate the lake's importance in enhancing the quality of our lives.

Debated and carried November 27, 2008.

- 61. Mr. Colle That, in the opinion of this House, the month of November should be proclaimed as Crohn's and Colitis Awareness Month, in concert with the same designation by the Federal Health Minister in 2006, to recognize the courage of more than 200,000 Ontarians living with Crohn's and Colitis and to encourage Ontarians to make finding a cure for inflammatory bowel disease a priority.
- 62. Mr. Wilson That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty government must increase immediately the number of long-term care (nursing home, Homes for the Aged, charitable homes) beds in the Counties of Simcoe and Grey so as to eliminate the waiting lists of people who can no longer stay in their own homes and/or are stuck inappropriately in a hospital bed through no fault of their own.

Debated and lost on division November 20, 2008.

- 63. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should ensure that the Sarnia (Erie-St.Clair) Pathways program of in-school occupational therapy, physiotherapy and speech language pathology for children with disabilities is preserved, first and foremost, and strengthened over time through appropriate Ministry investments in these children's services.

- 65. Mrs. Elliott That, in the opinion of this House, a Select Committee should be established immediately to develop a comprehensive Ontario mental health and addictions strategy;

That, in developing its strategy and recommendations, the Committee shall focus on the following issues:

- The urgent need for a comprehensive mental health strategy in Ontario to work in cooperation
 with the Mental Health Commission of Canada and to coordinate the delivery of mental health
 programs and services in Ontario;
- The lack of coordination in Ontario for the delivery of mental health programs and services across many provincial ministries;
- The mental health issues of children;
- The increase in suicide among young people;
- The mental health and/or addiction problems of homeless people;
- The mental health needs of residents of long term care facilities;
- The lack of access to even basic mental health services for aboriginal Canadians in many parts of Ontario; and
- The issues facing courts and police across Ontario in dealing with increasing numbers of alleged offenders with significant mental health and/or addiction problems;

That the Committee shall have authority to conduct hearings and undertake research, and generally shall have such powers and duties as are required to develop recommendations on a comprehensive Ontario mental health and addictions strategy; and

That the Committee shall present an interim report to the House no later than the end of 2009, and a final report no later than June 30, 2010.

Debated and carried December 4, 2008.

66. Mr. Moridi – That, in the opinion of this House, to celebrate the cultural diversity of this province, and to promote linguistic and cultural diversity and multilingualism, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario should proclaim the twenty first (21st) day of February as International Mother Language Day in Ontario.

Debated and carried May 28, 2009.

67. Mr. Klees – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should introduce legislation to implement an automated insurance verification system that shall be designed with the goal of identifying motor vehicles that are being operated on Ontario roads without the required insurance coverage and shall provide accurate and current access to motor vehicle insurance coverage information for persons and agencies charged with the enforcement of motor vehicle insurance requirements, such that police officers can determine the validity of the insurance of a vehicle, and that license-issuing offices can have the ability to confirm in real time, that insurance coverage is valid; and that the Highway Traffic Act be amended to provide for the impoundment of the vehicle being driven by an uninsured motorist.

Debated and carried September 24, 2009.

- 68. Mr. Arnott That, in the opinion of this House, the Ministry of Tourism should establish a fund to offer loans of up to \$25,000 to qualifying annual festivals and events that have experienced dramatic declines in attendance year-over-year because of poor weather or other unforeseen events.
- 69. Mr. Runciman That, in the opinion of this House, in order to adequately address serious failings of Ontario's justice system that have resulted in deaths of innocent Ontarians, the McGuinty government should implement the following:
 - a) Institute a policy of instructing Crowns to appeal all bail release decisions related to the commission of a crime with a weapon, possession of a weapon, and aggravated sexual assault;
 - b) Immediately invest, through reallocations, in a dramatically expanded electronic monitoring program, with instructions to Crowns that monitoring is requested when courts grant bail to individuals they, or police, believe pose a threat to public safety;
 - c) Institute greater restrictions on the Crown's ability to plea bargain, without first receiving consent of victims and police, on charges of crime with a weapon, possession of a weapon, and aggravated sexual assault;
 - d) Enforce and collect all bail forfeitures; and
 - e) Upgrade electronic information sharing among justice system partners to ensure courts have all relevant information when making bail and sentencing decisions.
- 70. Mr. Bailey That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty government should: (a) immediately order the Auditor General to conduct a thorough audit of the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board to determine if the plan to eliminate the unfunded liability by 2014 is on target; and (b) order the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board to publicly release quarterly reports on the status of the unfunded liability.

Debated and lost on division December 4, 2008.

- 71. Mr. Arnott That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should complete the environmental assessment and, by September 1, 2011 at the latest, extend GO Transit rail service to include stops in the Acton area, Guelph, and the Kitchener-Waterloo area.
- 72. Mr. Runciman That, in the opinion of this House, the Ontario legislature expresses its grave concerns about the possibility that the Government of Canada might consist of a coalition that includes a separatist party committed to the breakup of Canada.

- 73. Ms. DiNovo That, in the opinion of this House, Primary Prevention programs such as the Boost Child Abuse Prevention and Intervention program be mandatory in all Ontario Elementary Schools as requested by the family of Holly Jones.
- 74. Ms. Horwath That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should resume direct responsibility, control and oversight of provincial safety regulations by withdrawing the inherently conflicted self-regulation and self-funding model of the Technical Standards and Safety Authority.
- 75. Mr. Dunlop That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should provide adequate funding to Community Based Literacy and Basic Skills Programs so that the agencies can properly address the growing enrolment.

Debated and carried February 26, 2009.

76. Mr. Kwinter – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should develop a School Science Strategy, to encourage more Ontario elementary and secondary students to pursue a career in the sciences.

Debated and carried February 19, 2009.

77. Mr. Berardinetti – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Canada should commit itself to reducing child poverty by 25% over 5 years.

Debated and carried February 26, 2009.

- 78. Mr. Sterling That, in the opinion of this House, a Select Committee on Municipal Governance for municipalities with populations greater than 500,000 be appointed to consider and report to the House its observations and recommendations with respect to alternative governance models for larger municipalities. In developing its recommendations the Committee will:
 - 1. Work with municipal politicians, academics, experts and other interested parties to determine better governance models for larger municipalities.
 - 2. Recognize the low turn-out of voters for municipal elections.
 - 3. Recognize the very high rate of incumbents re-elected.
 - 4. Recognize the difficulty of a mayor to get consensus from a large number of independent councillors.
 - 5. Recognize the difficulty electors face in determining the platforms of the candidates with regard to broad municipal and fiscal issues.
 - 6. Consider the pros and cons of the current municipal governance model.
 - 7. Consider the terms, timing and conditions of a referendum for the approval by municipal electors of any municipality for any change of governance in their municipality.
 - 8. Consider the introduction of political parties and party financing at the municipal level.
 - 9. Consider term limitations for elected municipal officials.
 - 10. Consider models from other large municipalities in jurisdictions outside of Ontario.

That the Committee shall present, or if the House is not sitting, shall release by depositing with the Clerk of the House, its final report to the Assembly no later than the date provided in Standing Order 6(a)(ii) for the end of the Fall meeting period in 2009, except that if the Committee determines that more time is required to complete its final report, it may present or, if the House is not sitting, release by depositing with the Clerk of the House, an Interim Report in which an alternative date for the final report is established, which is not more than 90 days later.

That the Committee have the authority to meet at the call of the Chair, to call for persons, papers and things, to employ counsel and staff, and, as the Committee deems relevant to its terms of reference,

to commission reports and adjourn from place to place; and

That in the event of, and notwithstanding, any prorogation of the House before the presentation of the Committee's final report, the Committee shall be deemed to be continued to the subsequent Session or Sessions and may continue to meet during any such prorogation; and

That the Committee may examine any other matter it deems relevant to its terms of reference; and

That the Committee be composed of four members from the Government, two from the Official Opposition and one from the Third Party. The membership of the Committee shall be filed with the Clerk of the Assembly by the whips of the recognized parties no later than Thursday, March 26, 2009.

Debated and lost on division March 5, 2009.

79. Mr. Miller (Parry Sound–Muskoka) – That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty government should address the shortage of acute care beds in hospitals by providing alternatives for alternate level of care patients which include but are not limited to: an increase in long term care beds; an increase in assisted living beds for Ontarians with disabilities; improved access to living at home services; and increased hospice/palliative care beds.

Debated and carried April 2, 2009.

80. Mrs. Mangat – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Canada should ensure Ontarians receive the same Employment Insurance benefits they would get if they lived elsewhere in Canada and should supplement Employment Insurance support for unemployed workers in the manufacturing sector by providing targeted resources and other supports.

Debated and carried April 2, 2009.

81. Ms. Broten – That, in the opinion of this House, the province of Ontario should undertake a review of Ontario's current corporate disclosure reporting requirements, standards and compliance therewith, with a particular emphasis on additional financial and non-financial information to ensure that Ontario investors have access to all information material to them in making investment decisions.

That, in undertaking such a review, the Ontario Securities Commission ("OSC") should undertake a broad consultation with its own advisory bodies including the Continuous Disclosure Committee, concerned stakeholders, appropriate interest groups and individuals and other securities regulators, to establish best practice corporate social responsibility ("CSR") and environmental, social and governance ("ESG") reporting standards.

That, the OSC seek to develop and adopt an enhanced standardized reporting framework for both quantitative and qualitative social and environmental information, to ensure corporate disclosures are understandable, comparable, and outcome focused.

That the OSC shall report back to the Minister of Finance no later than January 1, 2010 with regard to its findings, together with recommendations for next steps to enhance disclosure.

Debated and carried April 9, 2009.

82. Mr. Dickson – That, in the opinion of this House, it is imperative that our Provincial and Federal governments work in partnership to begin a dialogue to address the 70% of Ontario's workforce that is in need of a workplace pension plan to accommodate our seniors population that is estimated to double by the year 2025.

Debated and carried April 30, 2009.

- 83. Mrs. Mitchell That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Canada should protect Ontario workers' severance and termination pay when their employer goes bankrupt by amending the Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act to provide employees with preferred creditor status, so workers' salaries and compensation rank ahead of banks and insurance companies; and by increasing the maximum employee eligibility amount from the Federal Wage Earner Protection Program.

 *Debated and carried May 7, 2009.**
- 84. Mrs. Van Bommel That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario joins the Government of Canada in expressing concerns with the proposed laws in Afghanistan that would severely restrict the rights of Afghan women and that we, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario, express our firm solidarity with the women of a democratic Afghanistan.
- 85. Ms. DiNovo That, in the opinion of this House and due to the economic circumstances we are experiencing in Ontario, rents will be declared frozen, beginning June 1, 2009 until June 1, 2010.
- 86. Mrs. Van Bommel That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario join the Canadian Government in expressing concerns with the proposed laws in Afghanistan that would severely restrict the rights of Shiite Muslim women hereon and into the future.

 *Debated and carried April 30, 2009.**
- 87. Mr. Naqvi That, in the opinion of this House, simple acts of kindness can have a profound impact on individuals and communities, and therefore the spirit of Family Day should be augmented by declaring the third week of every February as "Kindness Week" in the Province of Ontario to help strengthen a culture of compassion, thoughtfulness and kindness, and to counter a prevailing tendency towards cynicism.

Debated and carried September 17, 2009.

88. Mr. Brown – That, in the opinion of this House, local news sources such as radio, television and newspapers are important to maintaining thriving, vibrant communities, and deserve assistance if needed from the Government of Canada, and all members of the community, to remain viable through the current global economic situation.

Debated and carried May 7, 2009.

89. Mr. Yakabuski – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should amend the *Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act* to provide that, when requested by a municipality, the Minister of Transportation shall not refuse to enter into an agreement with that municipality to provide a tax rebate under the *Gasoline Tax Act* to that municipality for a purpose related to public highways under the jurisdiction of that municipality.

Debated and lost on division May 7, 2009.

- 90. Mr. Lalonde That, in the opinion of this House, in response to the current economic climate, the Ontario Government should ease the workload of business owners and allow them to focus on job creation, by permitting Ontario businesses that have a business number with the Canada Revenue Agency to use a single form when providing information relating to taxes they are required to pay under the Employer Health Tax Act and the Retail Sales Tax Act and premiums payable under the Workplace Safety and Insurance Act, 1997; and that updated information on this single form should be submitted to the Ministry of Finance on a quarterly basis on their assignment.
- 91. Mr. O'Toole That, in the opinion of this House, the Province of Ontario should act immediately to convene a Select Committee that will review Ontario's current policies on pensions and consult with all Ontarians to develop measures that will ensure pensions remain viable and protected.

- 92. Mr. O'Toole That, in the opinion of this House, the Province of Ontario should review the mandate of provincial Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs) to ensure policies established by the LHINs do not result in Ontario's smaller rural and community hospitals losing the level of service that they currently provide; and that in the opinion of this House, the Province of Ontario must act immediately to reaffirm its commitment to the principle of quality care, delivered close to home, by Ontario's community hospitals; and furthermore, that the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care establish specific dates and times when all community hospitals will receive annual funding, based on a formula approved by the Ontario Hospital Association and based on the principles of both need and population.

Mr. Shurman That, in the opinion of this House, the term Israel Apartheid Week is condemned as it serves to incite hatred against Israel, a democratic state that respects the rule of law and human rights, and the use of the word 'apartheid' in this context diminishes the suffering of those who were victims of a true apartheid regime in South Africa.

- 94. Mrs. Munro That, in the opinion of this House, the 8% sales tax increase will have a devastating effect on Ontario's cultural industries; that increasing the cost of admission to movies, live theatre, art galleries, concerts, festivals and other artistic events by 8% will reduce attendance, costing jobs and restricting the public's access to culture.
- 95. Mr. Dunlop That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario and its Ministry of Transportation support our Canadian troops by designing a graphic licence plate, that would incorporate a yellow ribbon and maple leaf, for Ontario citizens to purchase.
- 96. Ms. Aggelonitis That, in the opinion of this House, southern Ontario, and particularly Hamilton, would be an ideal location for a National Hockey League franchise, from which both the NHL and southern Ontario would derive significant economic benefit, and to this end the Legislative Assembly of Ontario lends its full support to any effort to relocate a NHL franchise to Hamilton or surrounding areas within southern Ontario.
- 97. Mr. Arnott That, in the opinion of this House, the Government should keep its promise to Ontario's volunteer firefighters by extending to them the same presumptive workers' compensation coverage already protecting full-time firefighters as a result of the passage of Bill 221.
- 98. Mr. Murdoch That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should support those Ontarians living with epilepsy by declaring March 26, Epilepsy Awareness Day in the Province of Ontario.
- 99. Mr. O'Toole That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of the Province of Ontario has a clear and important responsibility to protect the citizens of Ontario by:
 - developing a made-in-Ontario Nuclear Waste Management Plan;
 - taking a lead role while working with their Federal counterpart and other stakeholders to develop a responsible nuclear waste management plan;
 - working with the partners to develop a nuclear waste management education and awareness plan; and
 - ensuring that communities that deal with nuclear waste have all the resources needed to provide for the preparedness, responsiveness and long-term safety of their communities and regions.

100. This being a long term cost saving for residents taking into account future health consequences and expenses; diesel trains being more polluting than the cars they would be replacing.
- 103. Mr. O'Toole That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario has a clear and necessary responsibility to protect the senior citizens of Ontario from abuse, of both the financial and physical nature, by stringently overseeing power of attorney for property and power of attorney for personal care implementation; furthermore, the regulations surrounding this implementation must be transparent and accessible to the grantor and family members involved, so that senior citizens, who so often experience manipulation and abuse, can be rightfully protected.
- 104. Mrs. Jeffrey That, in the opinion of this House, deaths and serious injuries from fire can be reduced, the exposure of firefighters to toxic chemicals and the dangers of interior fire attack can be mitigated, and the extent of property loss can be lessened if the recent changes to the Ontario Building Code (OBC) to require sprinklers in new multi-unit residential buildings over three storeys in height are further extended to require all new residential homes be equipped with a properly installed fire sprinkler system.

Withdrawn September 15, 2009.

105. Mrs. Jeffrey – That, in the opinion of this House, the recent changes to the Ontario Building Code (OBC) to require sprinklers in new multi-unit residential buildings over three storeys in height should be further extended to require that all new residential homes be equipped with a properly installed residential fire sprinkler system to reduce deaths and serious injuries from fires in the home, limit exposure to danger from fire of children, the elderly and the disabled and to mitigate the exposure of firefighters to toxic chemicals and the dangers of interior fire attack.

Debated and carried September 17, 2009.

- 106. Mr. Dunlop That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario and its Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services should provide the necessary funding to equip and train all front-line police officers with Conducted Energy Weapons.
- 107. Mr. Dunlop That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario and its Ministry of Children and Youth Services should provide the necessary funding to create a Child Advocacy Centre in the County of Simcoe.

108. Mrs. Munro – That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty government has failed to help Ontario small businesses by reducing the financial and time burden of government regulation; and therefore, the government should re-establish the Red Tape Commission which it abolished; and, that the commission must publicly demonstrate that it has worked with small business leaders to reduce both the number of regulations and the time and expense required of Ontario's businesses and citizens in complying with government regulation.

Mr. Arthurs – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should aggressively promote the use of Ontario wood products in residential and commercial construction throughout Ontario in order to support the more than 63,000 direct jobs and the other 130,000 people who owe their livelihood to Ontario's forest industry.

111. Mr. Zimmer – That, in the opinion of this House, in response to the current economic climate, the Ontario Government should heed the recommendations of Federal Finance Minister Jim Flaherty with respect to sales tax harmonization, and the recommendation of the Progressive Conservative Party of Ontario contained in their 2009 Pre-Budget consultation submission before the Standing Committee on Finance and Economic Affairs with respect to Ontario's tax competitiveness, and implement a harmonized sales tax.

Mr. Runciman – That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty Liberal government's failures to develop and implement effective long-range plans to ensure the economic well-being of Ontario, have led the province to the brink of "have not" status and placed in jeopardy our ability to support cherished services such as health and long-term care, the environment, infrastructure renewal, education, transportation, tourism development, secure and affordable energy supplies, safe communities and agriculture. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division April 16, 2008.

2. Mr. Runciman – Whereas, one of the goals of the Ontario Smoke Free Strategy is "to prevent smoking among Ontario's children, youth and young adults"; and

Whereas, according to the Ministry of Health Promotion's website, each year 90,000 kids in Ontario try smoking; and

Whereas, an illegal smoke shop is operating on provincial land on Argyle Street in downtown Caledonia; and

Whereas, the said smoke shop is located within metres of Notre Dame elementary school and within a kilometre of a local high school; and

Whereas, residents in Caledonia report seeing children riding bicycles with cartons of cigarettes on their handlebars; and

Whereas, illegal smoke shops are selling untested cigarettes without warnings to children, and without asking for identification; and

Whereas, the McGuinty Liberal government refuses to shut down illegal smoke shops in Ontario, particularly the one on Argyle Street in Caledonia; and

The Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon the McGuinty government to move immediately to shut down all illegal smoke shops in Ontario and prosecute vendors of illegal cigarettes to the fullest extent of the law. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division April 29, 2008.

3. Mr. Hampton – That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty government must:

Immediately direct the Workplace Safety & Insurance Board (WSIB) to eliminate the flawed "Experience Rating" program;

Immediately direct the Provincial Auditor to conduct an audit of the flawed "Experience Rating" program;

Recognize the fact that tens of millions of dollars have been drained out of the WSIB's accident fund each year by employers who have learned how to play the game of "Experience Rating";

Recognize the fact that Experience Rating reduces employer claims – not worker injuries;

Recognize the fact that the practice of experience rating actually encourages employers to mis-report or under-report injuries and occupational diseases, force injured workers back to work before they are medically ready, and pay workers sick pay rather than have them receive compensation benefits;

4. Mr. Runciman – Whereas, Ontario's rural schools are the hub and heart of their communities; and

Whereas, in September 2007, the McGuinty Liberals promised they would keep rural schools open because, in the words of Premier McGuinty, "For rural kids, few things are more important than being able to go to school in your own community, with your own friends. Rural schools help keep communities strong, which is why we're not only committed to keeping them open – but strengthening them"; and

Whereas, in less than nine months after the Premier made this promise, over 50 rural schools are slated for closure;

The Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon Premier McGuinty to suspend any and all board-recommended rural school closures until both the funding formula review and a thorough assessment of alternate uses for rural schools have been completed. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division June 3, 2008.

5. Mrs. Witmer – That, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon the McGuinty government to restore public confidence in Ontario's healthcare system, by immediately initiating an independent investigation into the sad and tragic deaths caused by outbreaks of C. difficile in Ontario hospitals and report back to the Legislature in 90 days; and the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon the Government of Ontario to hold a public inquiry to determine what steps can be taken to reduce the risks of outbreaks and prevent further deaths related to C. difficile. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division June 10, 2008.

- 1. Mr. Runciman That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls on the Premier of Ontario to support much-needed changes to the Youth Criminal Justice Act, including:
 - Expanding publication of names of young offenders convicted of violent crimes;
 - Ensuring that persons aged 14 and older convicted of violent crimes face sentences proportionate to the severity of the crime, including life for 1st - or 2nd - degree murder; and
 - Making it easier to detain young offenders, prior to trial, who are charged with violent offences, or a pattern of offences. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

2. Mr. Runciman – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon the Ontario government to establish a Select Committee on the Ontario Economy to consider and report on options to address the challenges faced by Ontario families and businesses in the province's current weakened economy.

The Terms of Reference for this Select Committee shall be as follows:

- The committee shall, among other matters, review the government's current five-point economic plan and the proposals raised by members of this House during debate on the Government Motion on the economy tabled October 7, 2008. It shall make recommendations on specific measures to be undertaken by the government in the short term to address Ontario's most immediate and pressing challenges, as well as recommendations for a long range multi-year economic recovery plan.
- The committee shall be empowered to invite witnesses to appear before it as it deems necessary.
- The committee shall be non-partisan in makeup, being composed of five (5) Government members, three (3) members of the Official Opposition, and two (2) members of the Third Party. It shall be chaired by a Government member, and a member of the Official Opposition shall serve as Vice-Chair. The membership of the committee, including the identification of the Chair and Vice-Chair, shall be filed with the Clerk of the Assembly by the Whips of the recognized parties no later than October 31, 2008.
- The committee shall have the authority to meet concurrently with the House and during any adjournment of the House, notwithstanding prorogation.
- The committee shall have the authority to commission reports relevant to the terms of reference, and to travel within Ontario, if the committee deems travel to be necessary.
- The committee shall present an interim report with recommendations on immediate measures to be undertaken by the government no later than December 11, 2008, and the committee shall present its final report to the Legislative Assembly no later than March 15, 2009. If the House is not sitting, the committee has the authority to release any report by depositing a copy of it with the Clerk of the Assembly, and, upon resumption of the sittings of the House, the Chair of the committee shall present such report to the House in accordance with the Standing Orders. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division October 21, 2008.

Mr. Runciman – Whereas Mr. Nathaniel O'Brien, a convicted violent offender, linked by DNA evidence to two alleged violent sexual assaults, was released on bail and subsequently charged with the senseless murders of Susan John and her mother Saramma Varughese in the sanctity of their home; and

Whereas the Crown failed to appeal the bail decision to the Superior Court, despite DNA evidence and police concerns related to Mr. O'Brien's release; and

Whereas the Crown compounded its failure to appeal by not requesting electronic monitoring of Mr. O'Brien; and

Whereas Mr. O'Brien was released on a \$10,000 bond, with no deposit;

The Legislature of Ontario calls upon the McGuinty government to stand on the side of victims and their families and immediately call a public inquiry, under the Public Inquiries Act, into the circumstances surrounding Mr. O'Brien's bail release. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Ruled out of order on October 27, 2008. With unanimous consent, the following motion was substituted in its place and designated as Opposition Day Number 3.

3. Mr. Runciman – Whereas the alarming number of murders and other violent crimes allegedly committed by violent criminals who were out on bail for other alleged violent crimes in Ontario raises Ontarians' fears for their safety and shakes the public's confidence in the administration of justice in Ontario; and

Whereas the issue of violent crimes alleged to have been committed by people out on bail when they should have been behind bars based on their past criminal behaviour is a serious public safety problem that the McGuinty government has failed to address since being first elected in 2003;

The Legislature of Ontario calls on the McGuinty government to call a public inquiry into Ontario's bail system. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division October 28, 2008.

4. Mr. Hampton – Whereas adult caregivers such as grandparents and other custodians do their best to provide stability for children placed in their care due to often unforeseen and unfortunate circumstances; and

Whereas the duration of custody often extends for an indeterminate length of time and previous regulations recognized the realities of these custodial relationships; and

Whereas most seniors are ineligible for Ontario Works assistance on the basis of their eligibility for seniors' income assistance programs that have no provisions to address the custodial responsibilities of these individuals; and

Whereas grandparents are ineligible for foster parents supports and the Ministry of Community and Social Services' Temporary Care Assistance provision was the only program available to these custodial grandparents before the McGuinty government eliminated this assistance by changing the provisions in July 2008;

The Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls on the McGuinty government to undo its punitive revisions to the Ministry of Community and Social Services' Temporary Care Assistance directive and support Ontario's grandparents and other temporary caregivers as they seek

to work in the best interests of some of Ontario's most vulnerable children. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division November 4, 2008.

5. Mr. Runciman – Whereas Bill 119, An Act to amend the Workplace Safety and Insurance Act, 1997, will impose an oppressive \$11,000 new tax on small construction companies in Ontario; and

Whereas the notion that the bill will improve workplace safety is questionable, as it includes thousands of office workers who never set foot on a construction site; and

Whereas there are still serious and alarming concerns about the wisdom of the McGuinty Liberals imposing this additional tax burden on business, especially during a severe economic downturn in this province; and

Whereas the changes proposed under the bill will not come into effect until 2012, giving the McGuinty Liberals more than adequate time to allow a much more democratic process before they push the bill through using their majority;

The Legislature of Ontario calls on the McGuinty government to extend public hearings on the bill to communities across Ontario in early 2009 and allow all Members to speak to the bill before it becomes law. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division November 19, 2008.

SPRING PERIOD 2009

1. Mr. Runciman – Whereas, under the McGuinty government's watch, the province's total debt has grown by a whopping \$62 billion to \$173 billion; and

Whereas, our total debt load has already escalated to \$13,515 for every man, woman and child in Ontario; and

Whereas, the McGuinty government has increased government spending by an unmanageable 40 percent; and

Whereas, despite difficult economic times, the McGuinty Liberals intend to continue squandering Ontarians' hard-earned tax dollars by spending beyond their means with a deficit of at least \$18 billion over 2 years;

The Legislative Assembly calls upon the Premier and his government to publicly announce a detailed deficit reduction plan with specific measures and timelines to eliminate, in the very least, the McGuinty deficit of \$18 billon. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division April 1, 2009.

2. Mr. Runciman – Whereas, the budget introduced on March 26, 2009 would give the McGuinty government the authority to spend an extraordinary and unprecedented amount of taxpayer money;

Whereas, since 2005, the Auditor General has been highly critical of the McGuinty government's lack of accountability, controls and transparency with respect to transfers of taxpayer money, particularly at the end of the fiscal year;

That the Legislative Assembly call on the McGuinty government to amend Bill 162 to provide that the McGuinty government table reports in this House no later than 5 sitting days before the end of each of the sitting periods of the 2009-2010 fiscal year:

- a. to provide on-going economic and fiscal updates;
- b. to detail the actual implementation of the budget;
- c. to itemize the actual effects of the budget with respect to the minimizing of existing job losses, the creation of new private sector jobs, the provision of economic stimulus in a manner fair to all regions of Ontario, the assurance that the government's deficit is not a burden to future generations;
- d. to disclose the name of the project to which the infrastructure funding is being provided, the nature of the project and what it is intended to achieve in fighting the recession, its location (including the provincial electoral district in which it is located), the amount of provincial funding involved, any other funding partners and the amounts of their contributions, the department and program under which the provincial funding is being provided; and

That each such report shall automatically and immediately be posted on an accessible and interactive government website, and be referred to the Standing Committee on Estimates and to the Auditor General. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division April 8, 2009.

3. Mrs. Witmer – Whereas, the McGuinty government has no plan to address hospital deficits and protect patients' services; and

Whereas, the health policies of the McGuinty government are responsible for the elimination of out-patient services, bed closures, the layoff of hospital staff such as nurses and the potential loss of hospital services and emergency rooms in communities such as Ottawa, Cornwall, Belleville, Kingston, Kitchener, Cambridge, Guelph, Hamilton, Burlington, Fort Erie, Welland, Port Colborne, St. Catharines, Simcoe, Alliston, Strathroy, Petrolia, Wallaceburg, Chatham, Sudbury, Burk's Falls, Pickering, Ajax, Oshawa and Toronto; and

Whereas these decisions are being made unilaterally by Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs) without full consultation and consideration of the concerns of the residents in these affected communities;

The Legislative Assembly calls on the McGuinty government to acknowledge the needs of Ontario's growing communities and our aging population and develop a plan to address growing hospital volumes, protect patients' services, prevent nurses from being fired and address growing hospital deficits. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division April 29, 2009.

4. Mr. Runciman – Whereas on March 26, 2009, Dalton McGuinty once again broke his solemn promise to Ontarians and announced a massive McGuinty sales tax; and

Whereas the McGuinty sales tax increase will force homebuyers and sellers to pay more tax on services associated with real estate transactions, including but not limited to: legal fees, moving expenses, real estate commissions, development charges, home inspection fees and other closing costs; and

Whereas the McGuinty sales tax will cause home renovators and builders a massive McGuinty-driven cost increase through increased McGuinty sales tax charges; and

Whereas the McGuinty sales tax will cause vulnerable citizens, including seniors and renters, significant cost increases due to McGuinty sales tax charges; and

Whereas under Dalton McGuinty, Ontario homeowners have already been faced with a barrage of increased costs including skyrocketing property assessments and land transfer taxes; and

Whereas an economic recession is the worst time for Dalton McGuinty to increase taxes and erect further barriers to home ownership; and

Whereas the housing renovation, construction, sale and resale industries are a pillar of the economy in Ontario:

The Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon Premier McGuinty to acknowledge that, due to the current economic downturn, this is the wrong time to move forward with his illadvised plan to yet again increase taxes on all people of this province. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division May 4, 2009.

5. Ms. Horwath – Whereas over 65% of working Ontarians have no workplace pension coverage;

Whereas the current economic and financial crisis has highlighted the weaknesses in the Ontario pension system;

Whereas the stock market meltdown has highlighted the negative impact on individuals near retirement saving solely on their own;

Whereas legislation currently under debate clearly states that the province has no obligation to ensure that the Pension Benefits Guarantee Fund (PBGF) can meet its commitments, potentially leaving tens of thousands of workers and retirees in the lurch and without a secure retirement; and

Whereas the under-funding of the PBGF means that members of under-funded plans may not even receive the \$1,000 per month minimum amount guaranteed, something that has never happened before in Ontario:

That, in the opinion of this House, the Ontario government should ensure that all Ontarians who currently lack a workplace pension have access to a decent retirement income by:

- 1. Providing a universally accessible province-wide pension plan;
- 2. Fully backing the province's Pension Benefit Guarantee Fund so that all current Ontario pensions are fully protected. This would require an increase in the monthly

benefit guarantee to at least \$2,500 as recommended in the Arthurs pension report; and

3. Ensuring that all pensions are fully portable and that plan members receive all monies paid into their plans including all monies contributed by employers. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division May 11, 2009.

FALL PERIOD 2009

1. Mr. Hudak – That, in respect of the Auditor General's forthcoming report on eHealth Ontario, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario authorize the Standing Committee on Public Accounts as follows:

That the Standing Committee on Public Accounts shall meet for the purposes of reviewing the Auditor General's report;

That the Subcommittee of the Committee shall have the authority to call before the Committee any witnesses it deems necessary to conduct a review of the report, including, but not limited to, Premier McGuinty, Minister Smitherman, Minister Caplan, current and former members of the eHealth Ontario Board of Directors and current and former employees of eHealth Ontario;

That the Subcommittee can, through Speaker's warrant, compel the attendance of any person to attend and give evidence;

That the Subcommittee can, through Speaker's warrant, require any person to produce into evidence such documents and things as the Subcommittee may specify;

That the members of the Committee shall be permitted to obtain production and review of any document or thing and disclosure of any viva voce evidence it deems necessary;

That any witness compelled to appear before the Committee may attend with counsel and shall be required to give testimony under oath pursuant to section 59 of the Legislative Assembly Act;

That the Standing Committee on Public Accounts has priority over all other Committees with respect to its sitting time;

That the Committee shall complete its review and file its report on this matter no later than 60 days after the release of the Auditor General's report;

That the Committee be authorized to meet at the call of the Chair and notwithstanding prorogation; and

That the Committee may, if requested, permit any portion of its proceedings to occur in camera. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division September 30, 2009.

2. Mr. Hudak – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario call upon the Premier of Ontario to appoint a Commission of Inquiry with a mandate to identify, examine and report on:

- a. whether there was any deliberate price-fixing and bid-rigging of contracts at eHealth Ontario and the eHealth program at the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care;
- b. untendered contracts awarded by Management Board of Cabinet;
- c. whether Ministry officials were ordered to obstruct the Auditor General from accessing offices and records of the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care; and
- d. whether there were affiliations between the Liberal Party of Ontario and persons involved in the eHealth scandal, including but not limited to former political staff in the offices of Premier McGuinty and Minister Smitherman. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division October 28, 2009.

3. Ms. Horwath – Whereas the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care has an annual budget of almost \$43-billion, the largest of any Ministry;

Whereas the Auditor General in his report on the Electronic Health Initiative explicitly said, "Throughout the years, oversight of the EHR initiative has not been effective";

Whereas the MOHLTC transfers more than \$14-billion to hospitals and almost \$3-billion to long-term care facilities;

Whereas neither hospitals nor long-term care facilities are subject to Ombudsman oversight nor are they covered by the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act; and

Whereas in a number of other provinces, hospitals and long-term care facilities are subject to Ombudsman oversight and are covered by Freedom of Information legislation;

That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should act immediately to ensure that all MOHLTC transfer payment agencies, LHINs and all MOHLTC-funded agencies, boards and commissions are subject to Ombudsman oversight and are covered by the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division November 3, 2009.

4. Mr. Hudak – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario direct the Standing Committee on Public Accounts to call Sarah Kramer and Dr. Alan Hudson before it to give evidence with respect to the Auditor General's special report on Ontario's Electronic Health Records Initiative. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division November 17, 2009.

5. Ms. MacLeod – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario call on the Premier and the Minister of Finance to hold extensive public hearings on Bill 218, An Act to implement 2009 Budget measures and to enact, amend or repeal various Acts, with such hearings taking place over a minimum of three weeks and in a minimum of ten communities across the Province of Ontario. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and debate adjourned November 23, 2009.

Special Debates WANT OF CONFIDENCE

Débats Spéciaux CENSURE

Mrs. Witmer – Whereas, the McGuinty government is unwilling to acknowledge the severity of the deadly outbreak of C. difficile in Ontario, in spite of 300 known deaths in only 7 hospitals which have reported to date; and

Whereas, the McGuinty government has ignored a recommendation from the Canadian Medical Association to take immediate action on C. difficile, in light of deaths related to C. difficile several years ago in Quebec; and

Whereas, the McGuinty government, despite repeated calls by the Official Opposition, has failed to appoint an independent investigator to look into the tragic and preventable deaths caused by C. difficile in Ontario and has also refused to allow the Ombudsman to investigate the outbreak; and

Whereas, the McGuinty government, despite repeated calls by the Official Opposition, has failed to call a public inquiry, so that the public would know why these preventable deaths occurred and steps could be taken to prevent further deaths related to C. difficile in hospitals throughout Ontario; and

Whereas, the McGuinty government has failed to reassure the public by providing a comprehensive plan to combat C. difficile, putting the public at further risk of contracting C. difficile in Ontario hospitals; The government no longer has the confidence of this House.
