

Sergeant-At-Arms. He protects the Mace and the Chamber.

In the first two rows on the government side you will find department leaders known as **Cabinet** Ministers.

The leader of the government sits in the front row and is called the **Premier**

The smaller table in the middle of the Chamber is for the **Hansard** reporters. They make a word-for-word report of the discussions in the Chamber.

The seats to the right of the Speaker are reserved for the **government**.

They face the opposition.
