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## An Act respecting The Corporation of the Town of Pickering

Enforcement	<p><b>2.</b> (1) A police officer, police cadet, municipal law enforcement officer, provincial offences officer or any person authorized by by-law to enforce a by-law passed under this Act, who has reason to believe that any object or thing is placed or left on a public highway under the jurisdiction of the Corporation in contravention of the by-law, may cause the object or thing to be removed and taken to and stored in a suitable place.</p>	<p>(5) Despite subsection (4), any object or thing that is perishable becomes the property of the Corporation upon being removed in accordance with subsection (1) and may be destroyed or given to any charitable institution.</p>	Perishable items
Identification, receipt	<p>(2) If there is a person in charge of the object or thing, the person authorized to enforce the by-law shall produce appropriate identification and inform the person that the object or thing is on a public highway contrary</p>	<p><b>3.</b> A by-law under this Act may apply to a sidewalk or boulevard or any highway within the regional road system established under the <i>Regional Municipalities Act</i> and the <i>Regional Municipality of Durham Act</i> if the Regional Council has passed a by-law under the authority of paragraph 73 of section 210 of the <i>Municipal Act</i>.</p>	Regional roads
