An Act respecting Peterborough Regional Health Centre

Preamble	<p>The Corporation of the City of Peterborough and the board of governors of The Peterborough Civic Hospital have applied for special legislation to change the name of the hospital corporation, its objects, its powers and the composition of its board. The applicants also wish to transfer certain property from the City to the hospital corporation and to transfer any gifts, trusts and bequests made to the City in trust for the hospital.</p> <p>It is appropriate to grant the application.</p> <p>Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:</p>	<p>(a) the persons required by the <i>Public Hospitals Act</i>; and</p> <p>(b) the persons required by by-law, to be chosen in the manner specified by by-law.</p> <p>(3) The term of office of board members described in clause (2) (b) is as specified by by-law.</p>	Term of office
Definition	<p>1. In this Act,</p> <p>“City” means The Corporation of the City of Peterborough.</p>	<p>6. (1) Any interest of the City in personal property that is used for the purposes of the hospital corporation immediately before this Act comes into force is transferred to the hospital corporation when this Act comes into force.</p> <p>(2) Subject to subsection (3), a conveyance executed by the City and registered in the appropriate land registry office vests in the hospital corporation all right, title and interest of the City in the lands designated as Parts 1, 13 and 27 on Plan 45R-8944, deposited in the land registry office.</p>	Interest in property

Objects	<p>3. The objects of the hospital corporation are,</p> <p>(a) to establish, equip, maintain and operate a public hospital;</p> <p>(b) to maintain and operate related facilities;</p> <p>(c) to participate in the education of persons who provide health care; and</p> <p>(d) to provide health care programs and services for the people of Peterborough and surrounding communities, including family planning services, programs and services at long-term care facilities and community programs and services.</p>	<p>(2) A gift, trust or bequest described in subsection (1) is to be transferred to the hospital corporation.</p> <p>(3) The hospital corporation is the trustee of property that, before its transfer under this Act, is trust property held in trust by the City for the hospital corporation and following the transfer, the property remains trust property.</p>	Gifts, etc.
Powers	<p>4. The hospital corporation has the capacity and the rights, powers and privileges of a natural person.</p>	<p>(4) Claims that may be made by or against the City with respect to property held in trust by the City for the hospital corporation before this Act comes into force may be made by or against the hospital corporation in its place when this Act comes into force.</p>	Same
Board	<p>5. (1) The affairs of the hospital corporation shall be managed by its board.</p>	<p>(5) No claim may be made by or against the City with respect to property held in trust by the City for the hospital corporation before this Act comes into force.</p>	Trust property
