CONFIDENCE**

**DÉBATS SPÉCIAUX – CENSURE**

Mr. Runciman – That, in the opinion of this House, since the Premier has not adequately handled the conflict of interest allegations involving the Minister of Finance, and has not followed the ethical standards promised in his Throne Speech, the government no longer has the confidence of this House.
